

Sliding Fee Scale for Income Eligibility

(185% Poverty/June 1, 2009)

Please see below for the income guidelines:

* Add this \$ for each additional person living in the household (i.e. if 8 people lived in house hold the new hourly wage would be \$32.91. This new dollar amount is figured out by adding \$3.33 to the hourly wage for 7 people, \$29.59 = \$32.91. If 9 people lived in the household, \$3.33 would be added to \$32.91 and so on. This same process would be used to determine the weekly, monthly and yearly rates.

Unit = Number of persons living in household**.

** A pregnant woman is counted as one (1) plus the number of infants expected.

In order to be eligible, a household cannot earn more than above amounts. These dollar amounts represent gross income (before taxes).

Income guidelines are updated annually, usually in April.
