## COVID-19 Trends and Preparedness Planning for Michiganders

On Tuesday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) shared a brief update regarding the ongoing COVID-19 response in the state of Michigan. Based on a review of the spread of the BA.2 variant, as well as increases in other states/countries, MDHHS is expecting a small rise of COVID-19 cases in Michigan to occur in the coming weeks, with a peak in cases expected to occur in early May. At this time, MDHHS does not expect there to be a sharp spike in cases like what the state had experienced in the winter months with the Delta and Omicron variants. Given the amount of people who have been vaccinated/boosted and those with immunity from recent infections, MDHHS is not expecting a significant rise in hospitalizations and deaths; however, there will likely be increased risk of illness for all residents, especially those who are elderly or immunocompromised. MDHHS is not currently planning to move into the Readiness or Response phase of the pandemic cycle given the current predictions but will follow the situation closely.
